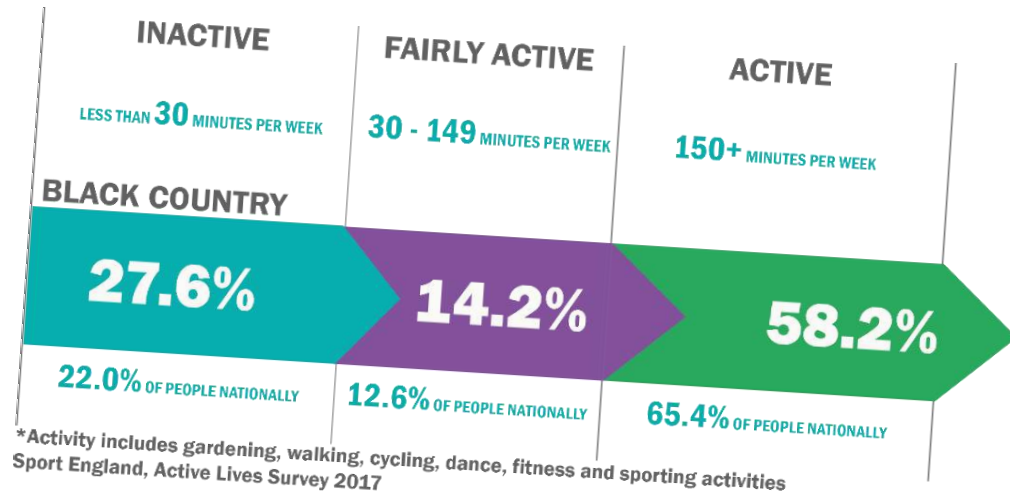

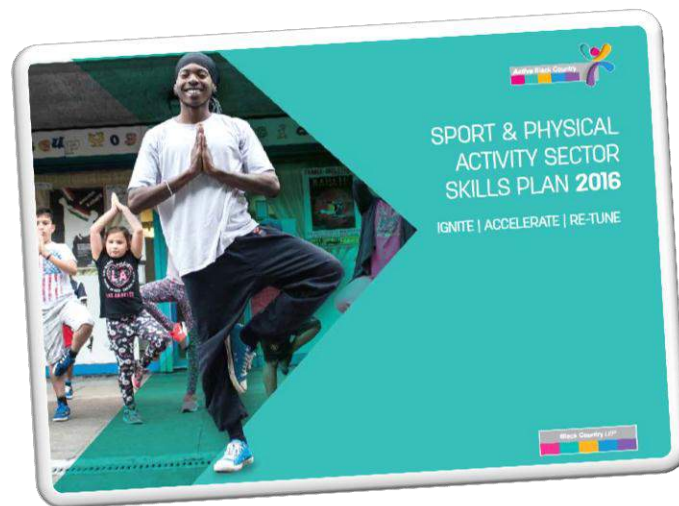

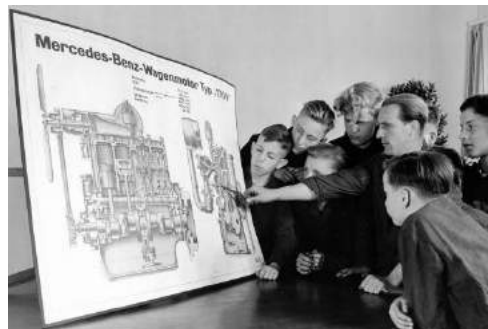
DEFINITION

- **Apprentice:**

“Apprentice” means a person who is undergoing apprenticeship training in pursuance of a contract of apprenticeship.

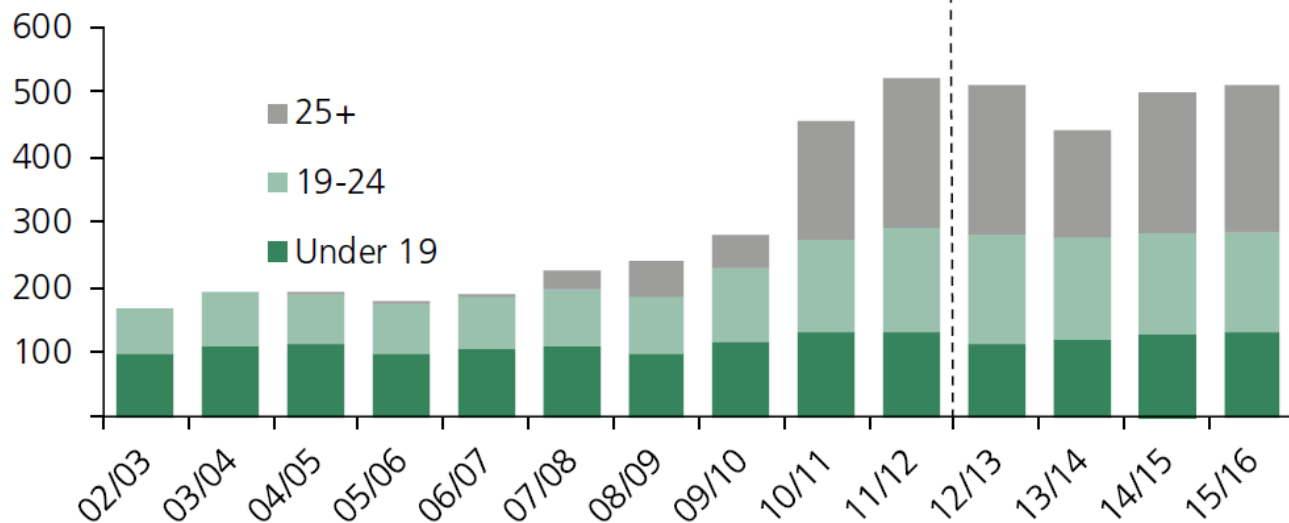
- **Apprenticeship Training:**

“Apprenticeship Training” means a course of training in any industry or establishment undergone in pursuance of a contract of apprenticeship under prescribed terms and conditions which may be different for different categories of apprentices.



Apprentice Starts By Age

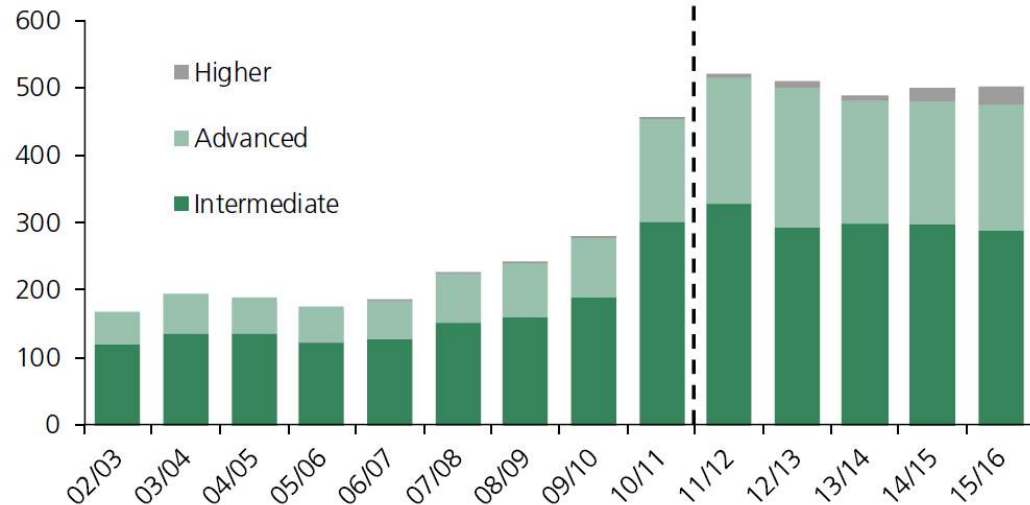
Apprenticeship starts in England by age since 2002/03, thousands



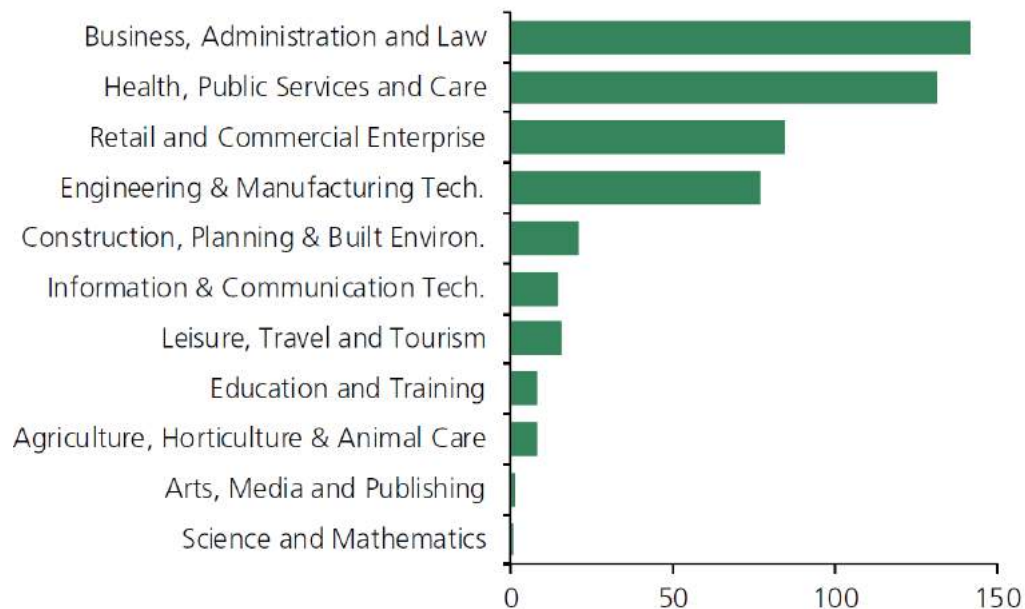

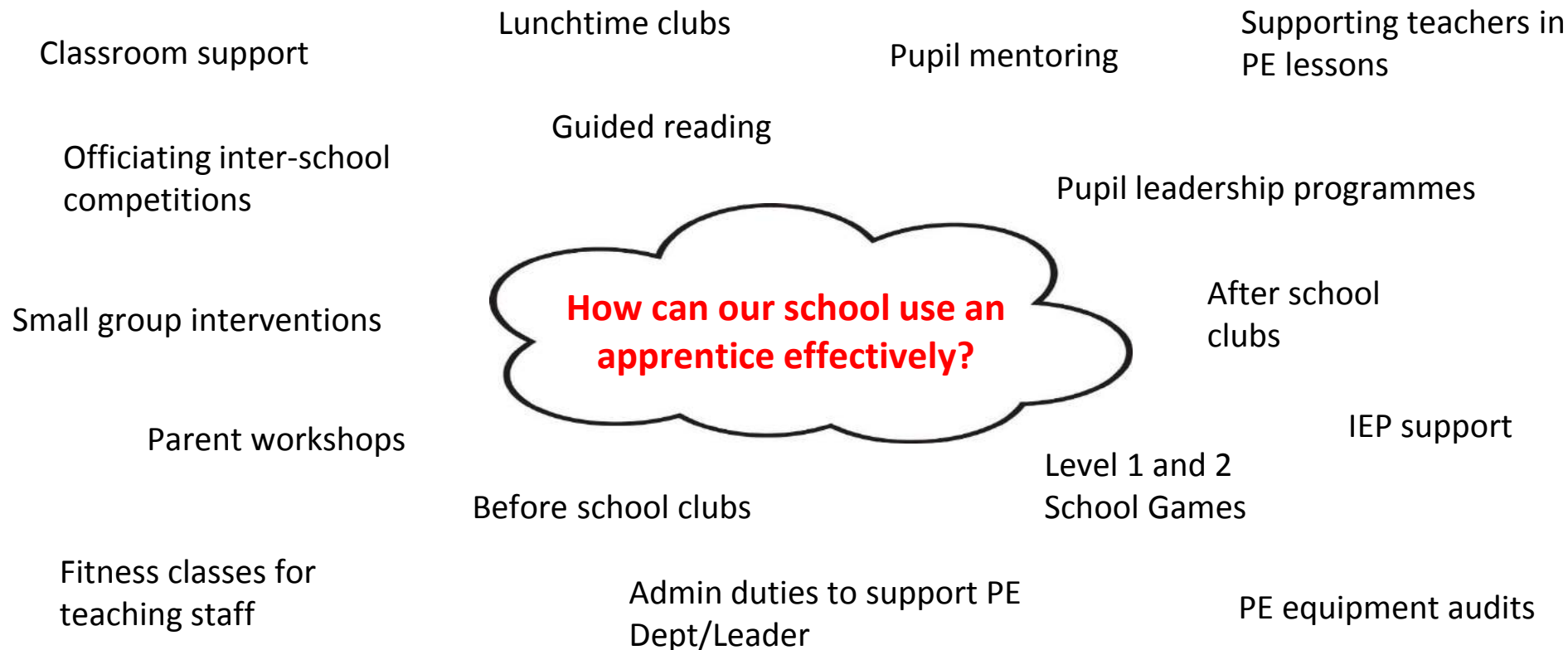
